Lack of resources and previous knowledge hindered them to accomplish to the fullest of their capacity. Remedial classes were conducted to fulfill needs of students from such sections of society viz - SC, Specially abled etc. 4- The practice: For the above objective guidelines were received from the department of social welfare. Students belonging to scheduled castes, scheduled tribes and other backward classes and specially able were identified and enrolled for the remedial classes.
